A STUDY OF THE EIGHTH COMMANDMENT

"THOU SHALT NOT STEAL."

1. As we saw when we studied the sixth commandment, "Thou shalt not *murder*", the New Covenant goes farther than the Old. It doesn't do away with the moral law of the Old Covenant; it amplifies it and sets a higher standard. The new covenant with Christ expects us not just to refrain from stealing, but go a step farther: "Let him that stole steal no more; but rather let him labour ... that he may have to give to him that needeth." (Ephesians 4:28)

If you cannot meet your objective, you will be released" Now the mechanic knows it is impossible to do \$500 worth of needed repairs each day without doing some jobs that are unnecessary. Studies show that more than half of the repairs made to autos were unnecessary, but, like the Goodyear Co., the employer requires it. a. What would you do if you were the mechanic?
